International Mountain Troops Summit

A highly successful first edition

Paris – 19 February 2025 - The first International Mountain Troops Summit drew to a close on 13 February 2025 in Grenoble, France.

With the participation of more than 1,200 professionals from 28 countries, including 40 high authorities in defence, homeland and civil security, 22 official delegations and 86 exhibitors from all over the world, this first edition of SITM shone a light on the **operational challenges of forces engaged in mountainous and freezing environments** which require them to review their modes of action, equipment and resilience.

2 days of meetings at the heart of strategic issues and best practice sharing

- Adaptation to extreme environments: discussions on logistics at altitude, transport in difficult conditions, equipment to cope with freezing weather and the incorporation of new technology.
- **Tactical and strategic issues:** dialogue on adapting to asymmetrical threats, the optimisation of operational preparation and international cooperation to reinforce the interoperability of specialist units.
- **Technological innovation:** presentation of the latest developments in the area of equipment, mobility and survival in hostile environments.

A showcase event for manufacturers in direct contact with armed forces

SITM offered the key stakeholders in the sector – manufacturers and institutional bodies – the opportunity to present their innovative equipment and supplies and subject their solutions to the scrutiny of users in the armed forces who operate all over the world, in the aim of receiving experience-based feedback from qualified professionals.
